## **Learning Disabilities Awareness Day**

**WHEREAS,** learning disabilities affect one in ten Canadians of all ages, and while a lifelong disability, they are not an indicator of intelligence, effort, or potential; and

**WHEREAS**, learning disabilities are neurological differences in how the brain receives, stores, processes, and communicates information, affecting important skills such as reading, writing, math, organization, and attention; and

**WHEREAS**, individuals with LD's are at significantly higher risk of mental health challenges, including anxiety, depression, and suicidal thoughts, often due to social isolation, feelings of inadequacy, and academic struggles; and

**WHEREAS,** October has been recognized as Learning Disabilities Awareness Month, a time to build understanding, break down stigma, and celebrate the strengths and talents of individuals with learning disabilities; and

**WHEREAS,** October 15 has been designated as Learning Disabilities Awareness Day, providing an opportunity to shine a light and focus attention on the unique challenges and achievements of individuals with learning disabilities; and

**THEREFORE I** encourage all citizens to recognize the importance of learning disabilities awareness, to support equitable opportunities, and to celebrate the contributions of individuals with learning disabilities in our community.
