- Midland has a busy and active Recreation Department, located at the North Simcoe Sports and Recreation Centre, in the same building as the Askennonia Senior Centre.
- There is also the Midland Curling Club.
- The YMCA Simcoe/Muskoka near Little Lake Park has an informative website. They are advertising zero dollars to join with no fixed contract. Many of their programs are suitable for seniors, with aqua fit being perennially popular.
- *Music in the Park* has become so successful that in Summer 2019, there were ten free Sunday night concerts in the Rotary Bandshell in Little Lake Park. This came about as a result of the collective efforts of public and private stakeholders. Watch for more information in the Midland Mirror.
- Active seniors will enjoy exploring Midland's recreational trail system. The Midland Rotary Waterfront Trail is an 8 km trail open year-round.
